THE SEVEN MARKS OF A DISCIPLE

3. One who makes a daily quiet time with God.
4. One who honors the tithe as the biblical standard of faithful financial giving.
5. One who participates regularly in a Covenant Group or Ministry Team as a means of personal support in community.
6. One who uses his/her spiritual gifts to reach out and bless others in our church and community.
7. One who reaches out, in the love of Christ, to invite others to grow as His disciples.

UPDATE ON LA ROCA

Have you been wondering what's happening at La Roca? The good news is: Pastor Miguel has been meeting with 75 other pastors (The Alliance of Pastors of Tijuana) to discuss plans for the new high school, which will serve approximately 250 students. It will be fully accredited, the curriculum will be Christian based, and the instructors will come from the other churches in Tijuana. La Roca is seeking financial support to build the high school and fund its operating expenses so the cost to the students will be minimal.

The initial design is complete and planning continues for the building of six small shops/businesses at the top of the hill above La Roca. Adults and older children who live at La Roca could work at the shops and learn valuable skills while providing income for La Roca.

As you might expect, the economy in Tijuana is in bad shape and Pastor Miguel said a number of churches are contacting him for help with food.

AWAKE, MY SOUL, AND SING

Today's traditional hymn #533 *How wondrous and great thy works* was written by Henry Ostic Onderdonk. Born in New York, Onderdonk was rector of St. Ann's Church in Brooklyn before becoming assistant bishop to Bishop William White in the Diocese of Pennsylvania. Upon White's death in 1836, he became the second Episcopal bishop of the Diocese of Pennsylvania.

The tune is *Lyons* and is attributed to Johann Michael Haydn, the younger brother of Joseph Haydn.
