THE SEVEN MARKS OF A DISCIPLE

At the heart of our parish is Jesus' call and challenge to be His disciples or followers today through contemporary spiritual disciplines. The seven marks of a disciple are:

1. One who witnesses to an intentional faith as modeled in the Baptismal Covenant. (*Book of Common Prayer*, pg. 304)
2. One who keeps the Sabbath and commits to attending Sunday worship regularly.
3. One who makes a daily quiet time with God.
4. One who honors the tithe as the biblical standard of faithful financial giving.
5. One who participates regularly in a Covenant Group or Ministry Team as a means of personal support in community.
6. One who uses his/her spiritual gifts to reach out and bless others in our church and community.
7. One who reaches out, in the love of Christ, to invite others to grow as His disciples.

GET OUT OF THE KITCHEN

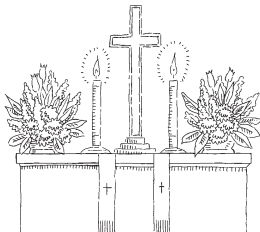


Join us for dinner this week. It's a great way to meet people and get connected. Parish dinners begin at 6:00 p.m. every Wednesday evening, following "Kid Music"

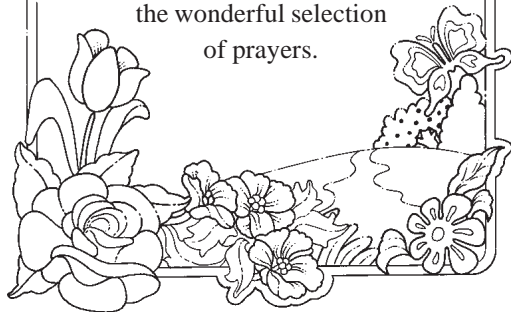

AWAKE, MY SOUL, AND SING

This is Trinity Sunday in the Church’s calendar, reaffirming our belief in a triune God. The traditional hymn at the 10:30 a.m. service, #362 *Holy, holy, holy*, celebrates the trinity. The hymn’s words were written by Reginald Heber, while vicar of a church in Shropshire, England. He later served as Bishop of Calcutta. This hymn was published by his widow after his death in India in 1826.

Notice how Heber uses many “triplets” when referring to God. For example, God is “holy, merciful and mighty” and he is praised “in earth and sky and sea.” The tune is called *Nicaea* and was written by John Dykes.

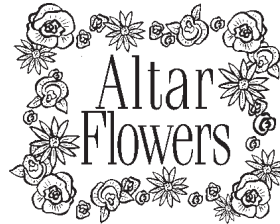
