- 2. What sort of characteristics do you associate with a dove?
- 3. How does this form of the dove foreshadow a different experience of Jesus than what people of that time were expecting?

## Took

Being in a conversation with God can feel a little surreal at times. We talk, but we don't see or hear a physical manifestation of God's half of the conversation. The situation can easily feel very lonely and self-focused for us.

- 1. How can listening bring more fulfillment and strength in our conversations with God?
- 2. What are some ways you listen for what God is speaking to you?
- 3. What can you do this week to practice putting more listening into your prayer discipline?
