## Look

#### Matthew 5:13-20

In this early part of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, he issues a sort of call to action. .

- 1. Why would Jesus' audience find "salt" and "light" to be elements they could identify with?
- 2. What does being "salt and light" have to do with the law and righteousness?
- 3. Describe the tension between the "law" of the scribes and pharisees, and the law of God.

# Took

Being "salt and light" right now can be a challenging prospect for many of us. Our faith calls us into action, but that action depends on each of our gifts. Each of us needs to understand what God is calling us to do, which itself can be a challenging task.

- 1. Why is it important to find the right calling for yourself? Why not just copy someone else?

- 3. How can you shine your own unique light to illuminate God's Word to others this week?
