Luke 13:1-9

Jesus closes out a long section of sermons with this final teaching. It forms a bridge to a healing story, but perhaps more importantly sets a context specific for the Jews of the time.

- 1. Why were the people present so concerned about the mingling of Galilean blood with sacrifices?
- 2. Identify each of the elements of the parable and who/what they represent to you.
- 3. Why give the tree one more year? Why not give it many years more?
- 4. Bonus: Read v10-17 and discuss how the teaching sets the context for this healing story.

Took

We are all unfinished projects in God's eyes. Whether we see it or not, he's constantly working around us in an effort to bring us to fullness in his kingdom. The key is whether we respond or not. Our mortality set a deadline for us, and it's up to us to decide to respond.
