## LOOK

The high of living in community is the opportunity to bless each other. Sometimes we actually say the words "God bless you".

- 1. In what context have you said these words recently or had them said to you? How did it make you feel?
- 2. How have you felt blessed to be part of the St. Timothy's community this year?

## BOOK

Matthew 5:1-12. Try reading this passage in 2 or 3 translations.

- 1. Do you sense a progression of the beatitudes? Why or why not?
- 2. Discuss the use of the word "happy" vs "blessed". Are they interchangeable?
- 3. Which beatitude feels the most relevant for you right now?
- 4. How is it possible to be blessed in the midst of persecution?

## TOOK

We also heard the beautiful words of the prophet Micah this week, "He has told you O mortal what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" (v. 6:8)

- 1. There are lots of verbs in both readings. Choose one of them and talk about how it might inform your faith walk this week/month.
- 2. In a time of as much cursing as blessing, how can we remain faithful to our call to be agents of blessing?
