Look

- 2. How did you feel after your Thin Space moment ended?
- 3. What factors (internal or external) help make you more receptive to these sorts of moments?

Book

Matthew 17:1-9

The Transfiguration is a pivotal and prismatic event in the Gospel narrative. It's a Thin Space moment for sure. Peter, James and John have seen Jesus perform miracles, heard him preach, and witnessed crowds of followers. Still, this moment stands out to them more brightly than those previous events.

- 1. When Peter asks about creating "dwellings", what sort of previous biblical "dwellings" might he be thinking of?
- 2. What reasons would Peter have for somehow preserving this moment?
- 3. Just for fun, what do you think would happen if Peter had created dwellings and convinced Jesus to stay on the mountain?

Took

In his summary of the Sermon on the Mount (Mt 7:12), Jesus says "Do unto other what you would have them do unto you." The operative word here is "do". He doesn't say "respond to others..." but rather implies action. Similar to "blessed to be a blessing".

- 1. Why does God grant us Thin Space moments?
- 2. Do you feel like you are more or less in need of Thin Space moments lately? Why?
- 3. What is one type of way that you can seek and serve Christ in every person you interact with this week?
