## Look

## **Book**

John 16:12-15

This passage comes in the middle of Jesus talking to the disciples before his betrayal and arrest. He speaks more plainly than ever before, and yet it is still hard for the disciples to take in. Here we get an interesting glimpse into into the process of truth.

- 1. What do you think lesus means by "you cannot bear them now"? (v12)
- 2. How does our hindsight make it challenging to appreciate the disciples confusion at the truth that Jesus speaks of?
- 3. Even from our vantage point long after this event, what part of this passage is confusing to you?

## Took

Discovering the truth is a process that requires engagement on our parts. Mistakes and bad decisions will happen, and are a part of being human. How we respond to them is an important faith act.

- 1. Why is it important to still honor ourselves when we make bad decisions?
- 2. How does gathering with others to discuss challenges and mistakes help in discerning the truth?
- 3. What can you do this week to be more engaged in the process of truth?
